GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

VENUE	Arthayasa Stables
COMPETITION GROUND	Show Jumping – Outdoor, Grass
ENTRY CLOSING DATE	16 August, Tuesday, 14:00
LATE ENTRY	Late entries will be charged at additional 50% of the total entry fee
HORSE PASSPORT	Horse passport issued by NF or FEI is required. Passports have to be submitted to the EFI representative in the show secretariat
EFI RIDER LICENSE	All riders have to have EFI rider License. No riders are allowed to compete without EFI rider license. License and EFI horse passport information and forms can be downloaded from here: http://www.equina.org/downloads.html
ENTRY FEES	<u>ENTRY BY SMS are NOT</u> accepted. Entry fees must be paid in full together with the entry forms and waiver form before the closing date. <u>Unpaid entries will not be allowed to start</u> in the competition
REFUNDS will be provided	Upon request, in case when horse or rider had a medical condition and were unable to compete. Requests must be accompanied by veterinary certificate for the horse and doctor certificate or parent letter for the rider. Refund administration charge of PR 50,000 will apply per cancellation. Refunds will be provided within 1 (one) week after the show.
ENTRIES	All entries have to be submitted on the attached entry form, any other form of entries will not be entertained. Entry forms have to be submitted to secretariat together with waiver and liability form.
HORSE NUMBERS	Horse Numbers are not distributed by the organizer. Riders are responsible for displaying the correct number on their horses at all time.
CASH PAYMENTS	All cash payment should be made to the secretariat office.

WAIVER FORM	Waiver form must be signed by each rider participating in the event. Riders under the age of 18 must have guardian consent. To be returned with entry forms.
GENERAL CONDITION	You are provided with plastic trash bag for the deposition of dung and other refuse. The dung must be removed from the sawdust daily and disposed of in a proper manner. At the end of competition, all stables must be cleaned of all dung and left over feed. The stables and other areas occupied by participants

must be kept clean and tidy at all times. You are not to burn sawdust or any other material inside the stable.

ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT Usage of electrical appliances and extension cords is allowed with permission of the Venue and/or Stable Manager. Cooking inside the stable is not permitted.

Are allowed on the show grounds. All dogs must be kept on a leash or suitably restrained in a stall / cage, etc.

Complaints and appeals must be in writing to the **President Ground Jury**, signed by the authorized person from the club making the complaint and presented personally the appeal committee together with any supporting note evidence and names of witnesses and the deposit of **Rp. 1,000.000,-**. Complaints must be made not later then 30 minutes after the result are announced. If the complaint is accepted OC will refund the deposit conversely if the complaint is not accepted the deposit will remain with the OC. Refer to the FEI Art. 167 Of General Rules & regulations for more details.

DRESS CODE

DOGS

APPEALS

1. **Headgear.** Wearing a <u>hard riding hat</u> is compulsory for anyone riding at the event.

2. **Dress.** White, light colored or black gloves are allowed. White or light colored breeches and black gloves are allowed, white stock or tie, black riding boots, a dark colour jacket, helmet when competing and <u>during the presentation of prizes</u>.

3. **Spurs.** Capable of wounding a horse are forbidden. Spurs must be of smooth metal. There must be a shank pointing only towards the rear, which must be no more than 3.5 cm long. The end must be blunt in order to prevent wounding a horse. If the shank is curved, the spurs must be worn only with the shank directed downwards.

4. Whips. If a whip is carried in the Cross-Country and/or Jumping Tests, it must not be weighted at the end or exceed 75 cm (30 inches). Dressage: Whips up to 110cm length may only be used in non-FEI tests and outside the competition arena. For Walk Trot Test whips up to 110cm length are permitted.

5. **Boots.** In all Tests, <u>boots</u> (other than as part of regulation service dress) must be black. They must either be long boots in one piece or a full grain smooth leather leg piece and leather boot.

6. **Gear** . Snaffle bridle compulsory for all dressage tests up to Medium level. Medium and Advanced level double bridle optional, Prix St. Georges compulsory. If using double bridle, spurs must be worn. For **Walk Trot Test** simple side reins and whips









up to 110cm length are permitted.

SEA GAMES QUALIFICATION - POINT CALCULATION, JUMPING

Article 655 - THE FEI WORLD CUP™ COMPETITIONS

1. The FEI World Cup[™] competitions are run according to the following formula: Competition against the clock with one initial course, with one jump-off only against the clock. Table A mixed, Art. 238.2.2.

1.1. The formula of Art.238.2.2 is to read as follows:

Table A competition against the clock with one initial round and one jump-off against the clock. Competitors with equality of penalties for first place in the initial round jump-of against the clock. The remaining competitors are classified according to their penalties and time in the initial round.

Article 656 – FEI WORLD CUP™ POINTS

1. FEI World Cup™ Point System

1.1. Number of competitors attributed points

FEI World Cup[™] points are awarded to competitors only (not competitor/horse combination) for each FEI World Cup[™] competition. Points are awarded to the 16 best placed competitors.

1.2. Equality of points

Points won by competitors who are tied are added and divided equally. Fractions of 0.5 or more are rounded up; fractions of less than 0.5 are rounded down.

1.3. Competitions with less than sixteen competitors

If there are less than 16 competitors starting the initial course of a FEI World Cup[™] competition, the scale of points will be reduced accordingly. Only riders who have completed the initial round will get points.

1.4. Qualifying competitions with less than 16 competitors – Outside Europe

If, outside Western Europe, an event uses a separate competition to qualify FEI World Cup[™] Jumping Rules 13 Art. 656 competitors for the FEI World Cup[™] competition on the same day and if the number of competitors finishing the initial round in the FEI World Cup[™] competition is less than 16, the results of the previous qualifying competition are taken into account for the allocation of the remaining FEI World Cup[™] points.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSES

The Federation Equestre International (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.

2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.

3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.

4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.

5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

2011 FEI WORLD JUMPING CHALLENGE



This year, the FEI WORLD Jumping CHALLENGE is entering its 33rd year of existence. No less than 50 NFs have applied for one of the three different categories.

Originally, this Competition was created to provide less experienced jumping riders with an opportunity to compete on an International level without having to leave their own countries. This Competition also contributed to develop jumping - one of the Olympic and most popular equestrian disciplines world-wide. Many riders who have participated in the FEI World Jumping Challenge successfully competed or still compete at elite level.

The FEI World Jumping Challenge may be organised by any member NF of the FEI.

The introduction of a Category C (1 m) and the reduction of the size of the arena (65x45m) last year have proven to be successful. Therefore, no changes have been made for this 33rd edition.

The 3 categories are as follows: Category A (1.20m), Category B (1.10m) and Category C (1.00). For Categories A and B, the complete competition consists of 2 competitions of 2 rounds and for Category C, one competition of 4 rounds over different courses designed by a Course Designer appointed by the FEI. This year, Mr. Louis Konickx from the Netherlands has produced the course plans.

For a few years now, the FEI World Jumping Challenge is directly linked to the FEI Coach Education System, therefore allowing this event to not only be a classic type competition but serve as an educational purpose at the same time. (www.fei.org > Development > Coaching).

The addition of trot sections in the lowest category had a difficult start but is recognized now by coaches and riders who have a better understanding of the educational purpose linked to these trot sections.
